

So many of you mentioned to me that it was your favorite Festival so far. One special memory for me made it to the front page of the Sunday, June 4th, Toledo Blade: King Wamba (John Howard) next to Queen Sancha (Kim Howard) knights the Duke and Dutchess of Stratford, (Jeff and Paulette Mills), for their heroic service on the parade committee, while long-time, Royal Herald (Eric Hillenbrand) looks on in his kilt. While I'm not in the picture, my sword (a replica English Longsword from a Renaissance faire) is, making it one of the few swords to ever get on the front page of a newspaper named after swords. That's got to be a lifetime achievement for swords.

Our Royals also created special merchandise for the 50th Festival which they sold, using design ideas as wide-ranging as the 1909 King Wamba Carnival iconography and a tee shirt inspired by a John Lennon photograph. They gifted the proceeds from this sale – over \$3200 – to the Preservation Committee, who further supported their work with a pancake breakfast. And Preservation has been hard at work! 624 Delaware has a new roof as work steadily continues on this pioneering project. Two other transformative endeavors are also now underway. WGTE has begun filming a 'Toledo Story' about the Old West End. They captured footage from Festival and will continue to gather anecdotes and photos to present a full picture of our neighborhood (and not a Libbey biopic.) Many thanks to **Dan Finkel**, our liaison to WGTE!

Furthermore, **Dave Kosmyna** from the Historic District Commission received word that the City of Toledo received the full \$25,000 grant we had requested to create a Historic Style Guide. Simon Nye and Dave applied for this grant, sup-

ported by Jonathan Latsko from the Toledo Planning Commission. To give you a sense of how important this is, I want to share an excerpt from the letter the OWE Association sent to the City to submit with the grant application.

We believe the development and implementation of Style Guidelines, taken from the comprehensive recommendations from the National Park Service, will better enable the Old West End Historic District Commission to advocate for Preservation within City governance and the community, better educate the residents of the Old West End on the value of Preservation and instill a greater sense of neighborhood pride and enthusiasm for Preservation, and better empower the community, from all walks of life, to serve on a peer-governing board that aims to be inclusive and representative of its neighborhood residents.

Specialists will undergo a rigorous process to distill guidelines for our historical, architectural niche and to determine best practices for preservation. The tool then will serve to educate both our leaders who serve on the OWE Historic District Commission and to simplify and clarify for all of us what counts as preservation.

At the next OWE Association meeting, July 18th, the theme will be 'trees'. Michael Szuberla will be our guest to discuss the social impacts of trees, why a thriving neighborhood must plant trees, and how we might do so together. We'll also get an update on strategies to regrow our historic canopy.

We're on the way, Old West End.

New Police Chief Speaks to WOWE

"Organizations like (WOWE) are a critical concept, looking out for neighbors . . ." ~ Chief Michael Troendle.

On June 7, WOWE met at the home 12 a neighbor shared an account of her young daughter and friend being assaulted by two teen girls in April. 911 was called twice. It was three hours before anyone came and this Old West End mother was terrified of the lack of police response. The parent was ready to move out of the neighborhood - but for the care and concern shown by other neighbors.

What followed at the meeting was no tidy planned speech by Chief Troendle but real "get to the heart of it" police work. He explained that 911 calls are prioritized and sometime they don't have enough officers to respond immediately. The chief apologized for the response and inquired if there was a police report taken? ~ No ~ because they were told, if there is no video, not much can be done. The chief replied that they could still take a report. If pictures were available for identification, it would still be an option to press charges. "It is not just my kid, it is all the kids that live around here." ... was the reply from the responsible parent seeking to feel safer for the children in the neighborhood. ~ The moment had passed to confront the known bullies by the police. ~

The group attending the meeting was thrown into real gut wrenching, lively, question and answer-seeking discussion about this real situation, threatening safety in our neighborhood, with Chief Troendle.

Following are some of the hurdles that were shared later about the police department by Chief Troendle: They are trying to get more officers out on



the streets, they are continually trying to hire, having a hard time filling their academies, and losing officers faster than they can be replaced. The priority is having offers out on the streets. Thev


are looking at downsizing all the specialized units ... (911 is outside of the police). They are looking at other progressive police departments for inspiration. Time management is the biggest issue. Overall there are more good days than bad days. He deals with so much negativity. The police department has the same personal issues that arise as any organization.

Getting the officers out is having an effect. Foot patrol is having an effect. They have chosen two areas where they walk around the neighborhood. They hear that people are more afraid of the police than of the criminals. His goal is building trust. "On Patrol: Live" (the TV reality show on Reelz) started back up in February and one of their sergeants hosted the show - is having an effect on recruiting.

Chief Troendle was so generous with his time and covered current crime statistics besides addressing a host of questions from those who came to the meeting.

As an aside; a police report was filed that evening, a photo of the bully was put on the record. WOWE stands up to protect those who live here. Did you know we always have a "Blockwatch" portion of our meeting, more frequently than not, with a Community Officer? Please join with us!
