Very Strict 0

- Hand washing when touches anything
- Wears masks outside of container
- No socializing outside of container

Fairly Strict 2

- Leaves house for work/groceries
- Socializes with others at 6 feet
- Exercises outdoors in low density areas
- No intimacy/touch outside of container
- Shops once a week or less

Somewhat Open 3

- Socializes with <10 others at 6 ft
- Will socialize with others closer than 6 ft if at same level or less
- Goes outside of container with mask on
- Intimacy or touch if at same level or less

Moderately Open 4

- Regularly socializes with others
- Does not regard any social distance parameters
- No use of masks when around others
- Leaves container regularly

Very Open 5

- No precautions other than hand washing
- May desire to get infected
- May have already been infected

How another Generation Experienced Challenging Times!

Imagine you were born in 1900. When you were 14, World War I starts, and ends on your 18th birthday with 22 million people killed. Later in the year, a Spanish Flu epidemic hits the planet and continues until you are 20. Fifty million people die from it in those two years. Yes, 50 million. When you're 29, the Great Depression begins. Unemployment hits 25%, global GDP drops 27%. That runs until you are 33. The country nearly collapses along with the world economy. When you turn 39, World War II starts. You aren't even over the hill yet. When you're 41, the United States is fully pulled into WWII. Between your 39th and 45th birthday, 75 million people perish in the war and the Holocaust kills six million. At 50, the Korean War starts and 5 million perish. At 55 the Vietnam War begins, and it doesn't end for 20 years. Four million people die in that conflict. Approaching your 62nd birthday you have the Cuban Missile Crisis, a tipping point in the Cold War. Life on our planet, as we know it, could well have ended. Great leaders prevented that from happening. As you turn 75, the Vietnam War finally ends. Think of everyone on the planet born in 1900. How do you survive all of that? A kid in 1985 didn't think their 85 year old grandparent understood how hard school was. Yet those grandparents (and now great grandparents) survived through everything listed above. Perspective is amazing art. Let's try and keep things in perspective. Let's be smart, help each other out, and we will get through all of this.

You will also want to call her at 419-245-1200 and leave a message that you have sent an application. Please make note that if email attachments are too large, the City of Toledo site will not deliver. If you have large supporting documents, consider sending multiple emails to Molly.

Once the application has been received, she will send you confirmation of receipt of the application.

If you must use "snail mail" to submit an application, this will extend the time to obtain an approval as they are only in office once a week.

If anyone needs assistance with an application, please let me know and I will connect you with a neighbor who can assist you with the process.

DISTRICT 4 and the Warren Commons Project

WOWE has been forced to file a law suit against the Plan Commission and the Warren Commons Project. The Plan Commission would not allow complete testimony about the irregularities in the transfer of the land from the City to AME Church. Totally unconstitutional. As many of you may know by now, District 4 has 26 of the 40 known, drug and alcohol facilities in our city. We know there are more that have not been recorded. Warren Commons will be a 60 unit apartment facility, for felons coming out of prison or jail.

Yes, everyone has a right to live where they want, however, no more of these kinds of facilities need to be housed in District 4.

District 4 has been discriminated against for years. Beginning with "red lining" by the banking industry (we think it might be happening again). It has become the dumping ground for Drug & Alcohol rehab facilities. "Not in my backyard" has been the cry from other districts ... so, while no one was watching, these facilities were put into the Central City ... District 4 to be exact. WOWE will keep you posted as we go forward to protect District 4 and our neighbors.
