tax credit adaptive-reuse projects that convert historic commercial properties into mixed-use buildings. This includes marketrate multifamily, boutique hotel, affordable and senior multifamily, office and retail. ## From Neighbor Mike Szuberla:

#### **FYI from Mike: Trees and Human Health:**

Many studies have found connections between exposure to nature and better mental and physical health; for example, spending time in nature lowers blood pressure and

stress hormones. Ulmer et al. studied 7910 California residents for connections between health and tree cover within 250 meters (820 feet) of their home. The results indicated that more tree cover was related to better overall health, primarily mediated by lower overweight/obesity and better social cohesion, and to a lesser extent by reduced rates of type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, and asthma. The study's findings suggests that trees and nature can improve holistic population health in urban areas.

Mitchell, R. and Popham, F. (2008) studied the entire population of England focusing on individuals who were below the retirement age (total population = 40,813,23, deaths = 366,348) Their variables were income deprivation (poverty) and green space access. They studied whether the association between income deprivation, all-cause and cause specific mortality (circulatory disease, lung cancer and intentional self-harm), varied by green space exposure, controlling for potential confounders. They found that populations exposed to greener environments suffer less from income deprivation-related health inequality. Physical environments that promote good health may be important in the fight to reduce socio-economic health inequalities.

The influence of green space is not solely based on promotion or enhancement of physical activity. A number of studies have shown that contact (either by presence or visual) with green spaces may be psychologically and physiologically 'restorative', reducing blood pressure and stress levels, and patients with a window that looks out on a green landscape (rather than a parking lot or a wall) heal faster after some surgical interventions. Overall, trees are essential for human flourishing.
